

Leaders are encouraged to undertake risk assessments for weekly BB activities and before embarking on a trip or visit or undertaking a residential camp. This form should be used for this purpose. Risk assessments need not be complex but should be comprehensive. Regular activities and frequent visits to local venues such as a swimming pool may not need a risk assessment every time. However, it is essential not to become complacent. An assessment of the risks of such visits should be made at regular intervals. We recommend reviewing risk assessments on an annual basis.

When completing the risk assessment, consider: what are the hazards; who might be affected by them; what safety measures need to be in place to reduce risks to an acceptable level; who will take responsibility for particular actions; what steps will be taken in an emergency?
